Only 41 FAAs are accredited and monitored by the end of March 2019 as

a. One (1) USA based Foreign Adoption Agency was not granted re-accreditation due to non-compliance to ICAB standards.

Two USA-based FAA merged into one into one accredited FAA

c. One (1) closed their adoption agency due to funding/financial reasonsd. Two Denmark-based FAA merged into one accredited FAA.

e. Two USA base FAA did not renew their Hague accreditation. FAAs which are not accredited with The Hague, are considered not compliant to the Philippine ICA standard requirements.
