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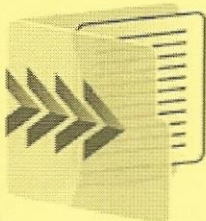


- One (1) USA based Foreign Adoption Agency was not granted re-accreditation due to non-compliance to ICAB standards.

- Two Denmark-based FAA merged into one accredited FAA.
- Two USA base FAA did not renew their Hague accreditation. FAAs which are not accredited with The Hague, are considered not compliant to the Philippine ICA standard requirements.
